



TECHNOLOGICAL COLONIAL JOURNEY featuring Paul Sanchez

Highlights: Paul Sanchez is the technological expert of cockpit gizmos. By working on a one on one basis with the pilot in his cockpit with his equipment, he debugs and simplifies the marvels of electronics. The Garmin GNS430, GNS480, GNS530, MX20, Honeywell KFC150, KFC225, KFC325, KMD550/KMD850, ART2000, EFS40/50, Sandel 3500, Avidyne EX500/EX5000, etc. are no match for his intrinsic knowledge. Let's go with the concept while enjoying a colonial journey visiting the historic cities of the U.S.: St. Augustine, Charleston, Cape Hatteras and Williamsburg.

Itinerary

Day 1 - Sunday, October 13: St. Augustine

We will meet at 9:00am in St. Augustine to spend the day exploring the nation's oldest city including a stop at Castillo de San Marcos - an outstanding reminder of the might of the early Spanish empire in the new world.

In the evening, we'll take a Ghost Tour for an exciting storytelling excursion through downtown and visit some of the local haunts!

Day 2 - Monday, October 14: St. Augustine → Charleston (189 NM)

In the morning we will have a briefing before heading to the airport for our short flight to Charleston; we will transfer to the elegant Charleston Place. The hotel is famous for its traditional southern hospitality.

The afternoon is free to explore this beautiful city and its historic district lined with tall, narrow houses of peeling, multicolored stucco, adorned with wooden shutters and ironwork balconies wrought by slaves from Barbados. Enjoy a stroll through Battery Park and White Point Gardens offering spectacular views of the harbor and Fort Sumter in this distance. Some of Charleston's most beautiful mansions are located across from the park.



Optional tours include a carriage tour where you will learn the history of the city while sitting back and relaxing; a boat tour to Fort Sumter National Monument, the island fort at the entrance to Charleston Harbor where the Civil War began; a visit to the South Carolina Aquarium or perhaps to one of the magnificent old plantation homes.

Day 3 - Tuesday, October 15: Charleston

Today we will have a seminar while the ladies are free to enjoy the hotel amenities including an exquisite indoor/outdoor pool which lies beneath a retractable glass canopy and the spa filled with amenities that will pamper and spoil you with its complete selection of massages and therapies.

You will also find the highest quality stores at the Shops at Charleston Place or go shopping along historic King Street where a shopper's greatest fantasies come to life.

Day 4 - Wednesday, October 16: Charleston → Cape Hatteras (261 NM)

We will have an early morning briefing before heading to the airport for our flight to Cape Hatteras to explore North Carolina's Outer Banks. We'll make a stop at the Wright Brothers National Memorial in Kill Devil Hills where the Wrights made themselves the first true pilots.

Please note that hotel accommodations and sightseeing are subject to change due to unforeseen circumstances. Air Journey reserves the right to amend the order of sightseeing as necessary. Every effort will be made to operate tours as planned, but alterations may occur after the final itinerary has been issued.

Air Journey has quoted this itinerary with a minimum participation of 7 airplanes.

The Registration fee includes:

- Extensive Navigation log (airports, route, frequencies, information of airspace, nav-aids, reporting points, flight plan) tailored for each aircraft;
- Flight plans filed on your behalf;
- Pilot briefing prior to each day's flight;
- Weather website with constant updates showing TAF, METAR, Wind Aloft, prognostic forecast and review;
- Flight bag and collared, cotton shirt for the pilot with his name and aircraft tail number embroidered on the upper front. Shirts are available for passengers and crew at an additional cost.

Cancellation, refunds:

- a) **Cancellation by the client:** Is always required in writing and is subject to the following schedule of dates, whereby some or all moneys paid will be retained:
 - i) Given outside of 60 days of departure: AJ retains the initial deposit of \$500 per person
 - ii) Between 60 and 45 days of departure: AJ retains 50% of the tour cost
 - iii) Between 44 and 30 days of departure: AJ retains 75% of the tour cost
 - iv) Less than 30 days or No show of departure: AJ retains 100% of the tour cost

- b) **Cancellation by AJ:** Should AJ cancel the tour after deposits have been received due to fewer than the minimum participants required, the full deposit will be refunded. Should AJ cancel the tour at any time due to factors beyond their control (including war, flood, force of nature, riot, civil action), they will refund the client whatever portion of moneys are reimbursed by ground operators and accommodation suppliers.
